

LETTER FROM THE MAYOR - DONALD R. BARRETT, JR

The statement, "Wilson Borough is not like it used to be" is 100 percent true. I see and hear it all the time. To that point, NOTHING is like it used to be. Wilson Borough is just over 100 years old, and like anything at that age, it needs a little work and some TLC. For years, a status quo was maintained because that is the way things were always done. It is that mindset that got us here and that mindset needs to change in order to move forward and realize this community's true potential.



black, with no debt service. We have NO outstanding loans and are excellent at paying our bills. Our front office works extremely hard to bring in money, but to also keep us on the plus side, ledger-wise. Sometimes, difficult decisions are made and while they may not be popular, they must be made. For example: Do you fix a pool that lost money annually, or do you replace an aging firetruck (over 30 years old) in the interest of ensuring public safety? These are the types of tough choices that we often need to make as a council and a borough. Contrary to discussions held on social media I have read, Crime has NOT risen since the pool has closed; it dropped! I do agree that there needs to be more things for kids to do and this issue is being worked on. A pool's closure, however, is not a catalyst for an increase in crime. In fact, crime went down 50% after the pool closed. Hopefully, the pool is not gone forever, but it needed to be filled until we could do something with it in the future. We cannot leave a 13-foot-deep hole the size of an Olympic pool open where somebody could get seriously hurt, creating a

So where do our taxes go? Simply stated, for every \$100 you pay in taxes, \$63 goes to the school district. Now considering our schools are listed as one of the top 100 schools in the US, I think that is money well spent and a great return on your tax dollars. Twelve dollars goes to Northampton County and the last \$25 comes to the Borough. Our budgets are always posted online and open for public for review.

Once again, crime is down over consecutive years. So far this year, there were 56 Part 1 Offenses. We did see a busier than normal April but, overall, our department is doing a great job. is because they are closed and I am still thankful for all our Police force have done to stay vigilant on this issue.

So far this year, our Fire Department has answered a total of 324 calls (EMS and Fire combined) and in an average response time of under 5 minutes. It takes about 2.5 minutes to get enroute. Our new ladder truck was just put into service and our crews are completing their required training. This will do nothing but make our department even better. We are blessed to have a top-notch department.

Public Works has it tough this year. I think UGI decided to work on every road this year and it is a ton of work. Along with their normal duties, Public Works is coordinating with UGI to make sure the roads are safe until we can mill and repave them. We are looking at 25 roads being repaved in 2022 and 2023. Yes, the road work is a pain and an inconvenience, but it will be worth it in the end with minimal cost to Borough residents. The gas lines were in desperate need of replacing and will last hopefully another 50 to 100 years.

As of today, there is an agreement of sale in place for the Dixie Building and, God willing, it will be sold and its rehabilitation and restoration will begin shortly thereafter. For four years, we as council have been working and trying to obtain movement on this. I am cautiously optimistic and don't want to comment too much at this time in the interest of seeing this through, but this is the closest we have come to seeing this become a positive beacon for Wilson again. Stay tuned. We have seen a warehouse project put on hold and concerns coming from neighboring communities about traffic it would generate. These same communities continue to build retail space and housing along an already congested area adjacent to this site. Both the Dixie and old Pfizer sites are zoned as industrial and need to be developed as such for us to gain revenue and grow the Borough tax base. I believe that both projects are a positive start in the right direction.

In closing, Wilson is old, and needs attention and work. A community of over 7,500 residents cannot ask or expect just nine councilpersons to fix all your issues and troubles. Negative comments don't equal positive outcomes and you can impact this community just as much as council can. I sit at most council meetings with an empty room, or maybe just three or four people in the audience at the most. Then, everybody is stunned, amazed, or upset about issues and want to react after decisions are made at council meetings. Come to a meeting and get involved. No, the meetings aren't exciting or glamorous, but you will see what challenges we face, will learn what exactly is involved in facing these challenges, and will have an opportunity to express your opinions. Hopefully, it will energize you to be part of the Borough; not just a bystander who simply watches and reacts.

Join us in changing Wilson for the better.

IMPORTANT ORDINANCES EVERY RESIDENT SHOULD KNOW:

- 1. Garbage may not be placed out for pick up until 24 hours prior.
- 2. All electronic devices must be picked up by appointment only. Please call Waste Management at Your Door. Call 1-800-449-7587, online at WMatYourDoor.com, or Email at AtYourDoor@WM.com
- 3. Curb grass (grass growing between curb and street) is responsibility of the resident to trim or remove.
- 4. Lawns and all grassy areas cannot exceed 10 inches in height. Under no circumstances should grass or weeds be blown onto the Borough streets or alley ways.
- 5. Snow must be removed from all walkways within 15 hours after snow fall. Under no circumstance should any snow be blown into Borough streets or alley ways. The Wilson Borough Fire Department requests that fire hydrants near your home should be shoveled open.
- 6. It shall be unlawful for anyone to store abandoned or junk automobiles, dump garbage, rubbish, or other debris of an offensive or obnoxious nature in the Borough of Wilson.
- 7. Business license: All businesses (including rentals) conducting business in the Borough of Wilson will be required to obtain a business license.

POLICE CHIEF

CURFEW ORDINANCE

Just a reminder about the Borough's Curfew Ordinance: Borough Ordinance No. 655 states that those under 18 years of age are not allowed out in public between the hours of 11:00 pm and 6:00 am unless that child is accompanied by a parent or guardian, going to or from work, on lawful business for their parent, returning from school or going to school, or on an emergency errand authorized by their parents.

Any child who violates this ordinance can be detained until a parent or guardian can be notified. Parents will receive a warning for the first offense. Subsequent offenses will result in a citation with up to a \$300.00 fine.

PARKING ISSUES

The Wilson Police respond to hundreds of parking complaints each year. The most common complaints are: Vehicles parked without moving for over 72 hours, unregistered/uninspected vehicles, and residents with off street parking who park on the street. Please remember that vehicles cannot be parked in the same spot for over 72 hours and all vehicles must have current inspection, registration, emissions, and insurance. If you have off street parking, please be considerate of your neighbors.

FIRE CHIEF

Although the state of Pennsylvania now allows certain types of fireworks to be legally sold to residents, please remember that the law also states:

- They cannot be ignited or discharged on public or private property without express permission of the property owner.
- They cannot be discharged from or within a motor vehicle or building.
- · They cannot be discharged toward a motor vehicle or building.
- They cannot be discharged within 150 feet of an occupied structure, whether or not a person is actually present.
- They cannot be discharged while the person is under the influence of alcohol, a controlled substance, or another drug.

The Wilson Borough Fire Department is always looking for new members. If you are interested in joining the department or have any questions about joining, please stop by the station on Butler St. at any time and speak to one of the firefighters on duty.

FIRE TRUCK

The Wilson Borough Fire Department has accepted delivery of a custom built 107 ft. Pierce Ascendent aerial truck which will replace the 2003 Metz aerial. Maintenance costs were increasing on the Metz aerial and after discussions with Wilson Borough Council, it was decided to purchase the replacement. The new ladder truck can be set-up quickly by one firefighter and allows the ability of rescues and access to areas that would be out of reach of ground ladders. In the past the fire department has used the ladder truck not only

on fire calls but to assist EMS with victims on roofs, special rescue scenarios, and also assisted our police department with evidence gathering. After tool mounting and training the department hopes to have the ladder in service sometime during the month of May.





Flushable" wipes, along with Clorox and other disinfectant wipes, are clogging pipes and sewer lines, and especially pumps at sewer treatment facilities.

The Borough of Wilson would like to remind residents to avoid flushing the following items: Diapers and baby wipes — even flushable wipes; feminine hygiene products and personal care wipes; cleaning/disinfecting wipes and disposable toilet brushes; paper towels; disposable gloves.

Flushing these types of items can cause backups in your personal sanitary sewer lateral and sanitary sewer main systems.

If a personal sewer lateral backs up, it is the property owner's responsibility and can be very costly.
